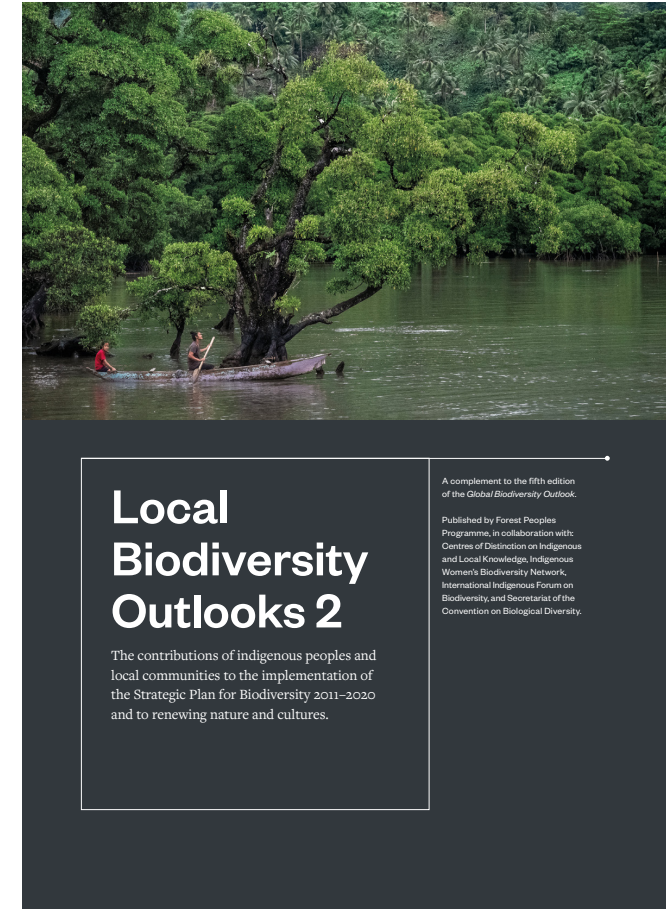
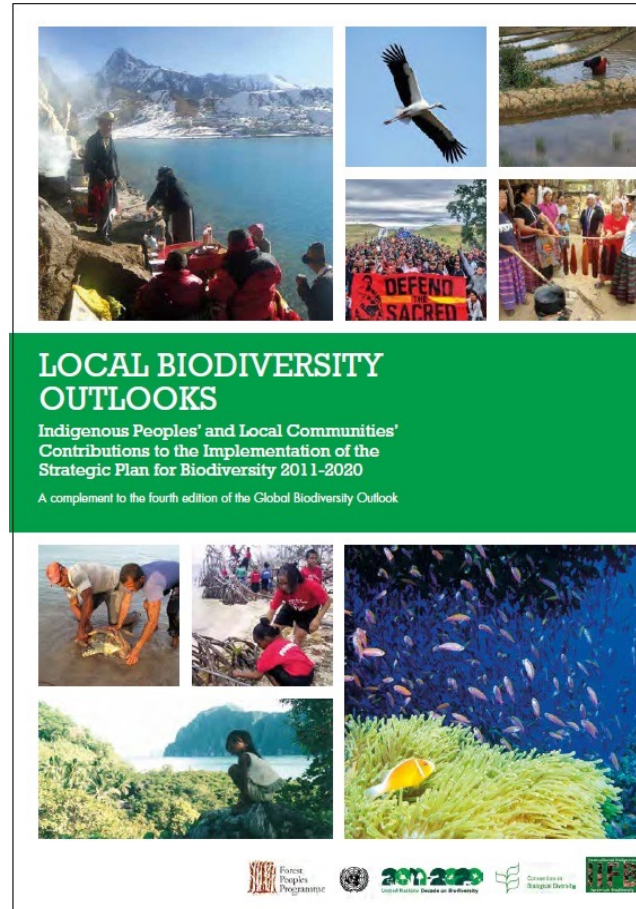

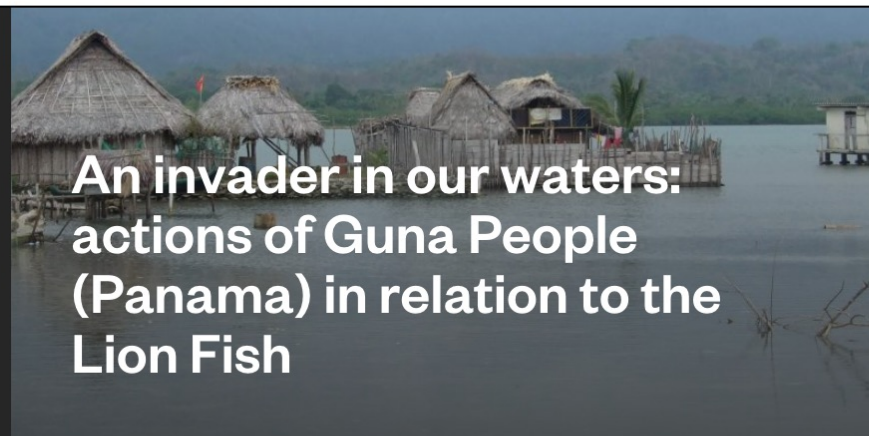

LBO: Monitoring, Reporting and Review of post-2020 GBF

- IIFB has been participating in post2020 GBF deliberations about “Options to enhance planning, reporting, and review mechanisms with a view to strengthening the implementation of the Convention”
- LBO will contribute to reporting on IPLCs collective actions capturing indicative levels of ambition and levels of implementation towards achieving the targets in the post 2020 Global Biodiversity Framework
- LBO highlights collective actions of IPLCs at different scales of implementation: local, sub-national, national, sub-regional, regional levels and global levels and linking these contributions to relevant policy processes: biodiversity, climate change, SDGs
- The IIFB Working Group on Indicators is developing guidance on Community-based Monitoring and Information Systems (CBMIS), including the use of relevant headline, component and complementary indicators

Inter-face with Sharm Al-Sheik to Kunming Action Agenda Platform

- Needs a tab on Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities in addition to Public sector, Business, Other Organisations, Individual
- In addition to Country commitments, it would be desirable to adequately capture and tag the multi-scale and geographic coverage of the diverse commitments – e.g. International, regional, national, sub-national, local
- The type of Commitment needs to include a category of Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities as a major group, distinct category Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs)
