WG2020-3.2 - Reflections

GBF

- Underestimated the time Parties needed to get back in negotiation mode
- Parties did take ownership of the text
- Geneva draft is long and complex: duplication across targets
- Targets from CG's with narrower mandate got more time and are better developed
- Progress was done in FoCs and CGs

DSI

- Went well beyond our expectation
 - Preparation work: Informal dialogue was instrumental
 - When Parties got engaged in designing a solution they are ready to invest in securing it



WG2020-3.2 – Lessons learned

- With time we can improve the text significantly
 - Should duplication of similar elements over multiple targets be addressed?
- Addressing B.bis early will facilitate negotiation sof Goals and Targets
- Where text was not negotiated at WG2020-3.2, First Draft remains the basis for negotiations
- For further guidance, consult:
 - Co-Leads observations and reflections CBD/WG2020/4/INF/1 (after Geneva) and/or
 - Co-Chairs reflections CBD/WG2020/3/6 (before Geneva)
- Considering Indicators when negotiating Goals and Target will help
- Parties want predictable process (less changes) & concrete outcomes from CGs
 - Will have to be balanced with need to be adaptable
- Imbalance between workloads of different CGs

WG2020-4 – Objectives of the meeting

- Text negotiation
 - Based on Geneva Draft (or First Draft where text was not negotiated at WG 2020 3.2 in Geneva)
 - Work toward compromise
 - Working toward clean text (removing as many brackets as possible)
 - Focus on resolving differences and narrowing down the 'composite text' from Geneva to facilitate progress in the negotiations
 - We are encouraging you to refrain from adding new text-ideas or concepts onto what was fully discussed/negotiated in Geneva.
- Placement of milestones elements: useful to resolve early
- How and where to address DSI in the context of the GBF



WG2020-4 Modalities

- Standard in-person meeting
 - In general, online participation will be limited to viewer mode only
 - Full interactive online access with speaker rights to be provided in exceptional circumstances:
 - Parties not able to travel
 - Self isolation following positive testing
 - During parallel sessions for singledelegate Parties
 - Regional meetings

- COVID policy
 - No limit to number of delegates on compound
 - Limit to number of delegates in plenary
 - Daily testing
 - Overflow room
 - Interactive online access

- Meetings over 6 days in Nairobi, Kenya (June 21 to 26)
 - No days off
- Daily Bureau and Regional meetings, full day for Regional meetings on June 20
- Likely three plenaries opening, stocktake and closing
- Schedule left fairly open to allow for flexibility and accommodate the needs of contact groups
- 4 info sessions, no side events Parties encouraged to use this time for bilateral meetings
- Final WG meeting before CoP15, need to have a draft Framework in good shape for CoP negotiations
- SBI and SBSTTA will provide requested advice
 - OEWG will continue discussion of elements relevant to GBF (e.g. Planning, Reporting & Review)
 - CoP to reconcile any differences

WG2020-4 Coordination with Co-leads


Objective:

- Ensure process coherence & integration
- Agree on strategy to address difficulties & slow progress in CGs
- Increase process predictability for Parties
- Avoid overlap and duplication
 - Co-leads need to be familiar with whole GBF.

Preparation:

3 virtual meetings in May-June + one meeting in Nairobi

Sections A to E

- Contact Group 6
- Useful to address section B.bis early cross-cutting issues
- Negotiating the Mission

Sections F & G (Goals and Targets)

- Contact Groups 1, 2, 3 and 4
- Will pick up where we left off in Geneva
- Need to avoid duplication and simplify the text
- Delegates are strongly encouraged to come to the meetings prepared to make compromises
- Bilateral meetings to resolve key divergences before and during Nairobi are encouraged
- Important considerations remain: ambition and urgency to act, ability to implement, whole of society approach and inclusivity, communicability of the GBF
- New scientific advice (mainly on targets 1-8) will be provided to Parties shortly, should inform negotiations

<u>Milestones</u>

- During WG2020-3.2
 - Discussions of milestones were facilitated by the FoC in Contact Group 1
 - Having a specific section on milestones was not supported, but there were suggestions to incorporate elements of the milestones into goals and/or targets
- Context and Objective
 - Goals & Milestones are about Outcomes (in 2050 and 2030 respectively)
 - Targets are about Actions
 - We need to
 - Enable timely discussion start and efficient use of time
 - Avoid duplicative discussions in Contact Groups
- During WG2020-4 in Nairobi
 - CG Co-leads are preparing a proposal for placement of the Milestone elements in the GBF
 - If needed, a friends of the co-chairs group on Cross Cutting Issues (including DSI and if needed Milestones) may be established. It would meet early (21 June) to address this
- The outcome of this work will be communicated by the Co-chairs to guide Contact Groups 1-4 as they proceed with their work on goals and targets.



 - FoC may be useful to address placement of DSI (actual text would be negotiated in relevant CG)


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
Sections H to K
