

Process toward the new PoW & institutional arrangements

- Peer Review of decision 15/10 Annex II
 - Deadline: 31 Mar 2023
- AHTEG on New PoW nomination
 - Deadline: 7 April 2023
- WG8(j)-12: submissions
 - Deadline: 14 April 2023 (TBC)
- WG8(j)-12: submissions on 4 traditional knowledge indicators
 - Deadline: 5 May 2023 (TBC)









Article 8(j) and provisions related to indigenous peoples and local communities in the work of the Convention

- Ad Hoc Open-ended Working Group on Article 8(j) and Related Provisions was established at COP-4, in 1998 (decision IV/9), with the mandate:
 - to provide advice to COP relating to the implementation of Article 8(j) and related provisions (decision IV/9, para. 1),
 - to provide advice to COP on measures to strengthen cooperation at the international level among indigenous peoples and local communities,
 - to review progress in the implementation of the priority tasks of the PoW,
 - to develop a programme of work.
- COP-5, in 2000 (decision V/16), adopted the Programme of Work on the Implementation of Article 8(j) and Related Provisions (PoW).
- COP-10, 2010, (decision X/43) revised the PoW for 2010 to 2020:

Postponed tasks of the programme of work (Decision X/43) **TASK**

In decision X/43, the COP 10 adopted a revised multi-year programme of work on Article 8(j), retiring completed or superseded tasks 3, 5, 8, 9 and 16, and postponed tasks 6, 11, 13, 14 and 17

- <u>Tkarihwaié:ri Code of Ethical Conduct</u> to Ensure Respect for the Cultural and Intellectual Heritage of Indigenous and Local Communities
- Mo'otz Kuxtal Voluntary Guidelines for the development of mechanisms, legislation or other appropriate initiatives to ensure the "prior and informed consent", "free, prior and informed consent" or "approval and involvement" of indigenous peoples and local communities for accessing their knowledge, innovations and practices, for fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising from the use of their knowledge, innovations and practices relevant for the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity, and for reporting and preventing unlawful appropriation of traditional knowledge
